## Remembering John (Jan) W. Drake (February 10, 1932 – February 2, 2020)

At the end of the last century, friends and students of N.W. Timofeeff-Ressovsky were preparing to celebrate the 100th anniversary of his birthday. Timofeeff-Ressovsky was closely associated with American geneticists. We were advised to invite Drake to the centennial of Timofeeff-Ressovsky, who knew the history of genetics well.

Then Drake became one of the founders of the conference "Modern problems of genetics, radiobiology, radioecology and evolution", dedicated to Timofeeff-Ressovsky. Co-organizer of the conference became also the Genetic Society of America. In addition to his important lectures on mutagenesis and repair, we must



say that he became a bridge between young scientists coming to the conference and American geneticists.



Drake took part in all conference events; especially he supported young scientists.

Together we wrote an article for the Foreword of the <u>book</u> "Genetics, evolution, and radiation" (2016). In this short article "Timofeeff-Ressovsky and American scientists", a connection is traced, sometimes large, sometimes breaking off, between Russian and American geneticists. This article also refers to the <u>Conferences</u> "Modern problems of genetics, radiobiology, radioecology and evolution".
